THE REVELATION

Jesus loved" woke up on "the Lord's day" like he had done thousands of times before. He prayed; he sang; he meditated on the Scriptures like any believer would on any given Shabbat, or on any given Sunday—but this day was different than the days of his youth, for now he was in exile. Rome's Empire had been unable to kill him, so they got rid of him with the most effective Plan B they could think of: a solitary confinement so rigid, the aged disciple was sentenced to spend the rest of his days on the island of Patmos,3 nestled in the south of the Aegean Sea just west of Turkey. But the God who sees4 saw him there, and on this otherwise ordinary day revealed something eternally significant to His old friend:

Himself.

John "heard a voice behind [him] like a trumpet, saying, 'I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last." Only One is the Beginning and the End, and John would have known that already. Even still, nothing could have prepared him for what he saw when he turned around to behold his old Friend from Galilee for the first time in decades:

"Having turned, I saw seven golden lampstands, and in the midst of the seven lampstands One like the Son of Man, clothed with a garment down to the feet and girded about the chest with a golden band. His head and hair were white like wool, as white as snow and His eyes were like a flame of fire. His feet were like fine brass, as if refined in a furnace, and His voice as the sound of many waters; He had in His right hand seven stars, out of His mouth went a sharp two-edged sword, and His countenance was like the sun shining in its strength."

These are deliberate words; John's vivid description of the Holy One aligns with visions and encounters recorded in generations prior. "One like a son of man" who comes with the clouds to rule forever. He comes to the Ancient of Days9—but also is the Ancient of Days, for the LORD is One and His name is One¹0—with the same white hair, the same fire, and the same power.¹¹ John did see his familiar Friend from the Galilee, but he saw more than the meek Man from Nazareth; He saw Yahweh, the Cloud Rider.¹² He saw Yeshua—Elohim, Jehovah, Adonai....the I AM.¹³

Naturally, John recalled: "When I saw Him, I fell at His feet as though dead." 14

The disciple's experience that day on Patmos—what he (by the Spirit) called "the Revelation of Jesus" 15—was a fresh and fuller disclosure of what God had already provided through the patriarchs, prophets, and apostles, but it was not new. John knew One—who was and is both David's Son and Lord¹⁶—would inherit the nations and rule from His throne on the LORD's "holy hill."17 He knew the LORD has a Day wherein He would "shake everything that can be shaken," such that even the loftiest things would topple and only the LORD Himself will be left standing.19 John knew this coming Day of Vengeance would liberate every captive, open every blind eye, and forever settle the controversy of the everlasting covenant. 20 He knew the Kingdom would be "restored to Israel"21 once every tribe, tongue, and nation had received due witness of the Good News of the Kingdom—and "then the end will come."22 Then the sky will split.²³ Then the Son of Man will return to receive His inheritance, reign from Zion, and restore all things.²⁴ Every war will end.²⁵ Death will itself die.²⁶ Coffins will splinter open and forgone remains gather as the power that plucked Jesus out of the grave resurrects the righteous throughout the earth; "the dead in Christ shall rise first," then any saint still alive, who had to endure the grief of burying loved ones, will likewise be "caught up" to the sky as the Son of Man makes His triumphal entry into the holy city, through the plain of Armageddon. 29 "Therefore we'll always be with the LORD; comfort and encourage one another with these words." 30

When John finally saw Jesus after years of persecution, exile, and abuse, he was remarkably unoffended. He'd fought to keep his heart tender. We know this because the moment he saw Jesus, he didn't lay into Him with a thousand questions or accusations or theological interests. He took one look at the Son of Man in His holy glory and...collapsed. And Jesus, ever so kind, "laid His right hand on [John]" and told him not to be afraid. He had a message He wanted His friend to deliver—and that the disciple did. We hold the Revelation of Jesus in our own hands today because of John's obedience and fidelity to the Gospel of the Kingdom—and its King.

As we meditate on this message, let us ask for ears that can hear what the Spirit is saying to the Body of Jesus worldwide.³¹ As we approach the return of the LORD, let us live with tender hearts, that we may not be offended at the coming cost of restoration. He will use the least severe means necessary to purge the world of wickedness, but His means are yet still severe. We will find the Jesus of Isaiah 53 is also the Jesus of Isaiah 63; He first spilled His own blood to spare as many as possible from the wrath to come,³² before spilling the blood of the wicked when He ends oppression and injustice. But when He comes, when He shatters the power of all that oppresses the sons of Adam and the daughters of Eve, all who've called upon and confessed His name will "marvel" at Him.³³ He will be adored forever.

The Revelation is not a revelation of a movement, or of a moment in time. It is the Revelation of the Lion and the Lamb who has "overcome," so that He can keep the promise made in the Garden of Eden so long ago. Let us cling to His promises and His Personhood, such that His word would "dwell in [us] richly, and that through "psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs" we would be "awake, and unoffended when the One we love—the beautiful Bridegroom—finally comes.



THE BELOVED



T is no accident John the Beloved opened his Gospel with an introduction to the Word made flesh, introduced the God-Man called Jesus, and then immediately shifted to Cana to tell a story about a wedding and how Jesus saved the party with the best wine. John wanted his readers to immediately encounter what he discovered about that Carpenter from Nazareth: God Incarnate is both the Bridegroom and the One who transforms us—we are the water; we are the branches pruned by the Vinedresser, and by sanctification we are matured into the superior wine. J

When Scripture introduces us to John, brother of James and son of Zebedee, he is young. Zealous.⁴ Bombastic. He's got a feisty mom with no lack of gall or sass.⁵ And he's got a temper.⁶ We don't know where he came from or where he was going, we just know that he wanted status and platform and power.⁷ He wanted to pull a "prophet trick" and call fire down on people he didn't like.⁹

But something happened to this zealous, angry, and adrenaline-driven young man in the few years he wandered the Judea and Samaria with the Son of Man; by the time Jesus led his frat pack on their last trek to Jerusalem, 10 we find a different John. He is warmer; quieter; more gentle. He's one of Jesus' closest friends, privy to some of His most personal moments, "and spent the Last Supper crammed in close enough around the table that he used Jesus as a pillow.¹² And when their Rabbi warned them He'd be betrayed that evening—including the finer detail that His traitor was sitting at the table with them—the other boys motioned to John to ask Jesus for an explicit name-drop, figuring he'd be the most privy to full disclosure. 13 When Jesus was handed over to the authorities for a night in jail, a humiliating beating, and a public half-trial, 14 all the disciples fled—but John came back by morning. The young "son of thunder"15 had been transformed into "the disciple Jesus loved,"16 and he was the only one of the twelve who refused to abandon his Friend at His execution. He was at the foot of the cross, holding Mary of Nazareth, who had borne her Son to save the world.¹⁷ He was the one commissioned by Jesus to take care of her until she passed into glory.¹⁸

History has it that John spent many years in Ephesus, which had grown into something of a megachurch community, serving as a father in the faith; Mary spent her final years with him there, shepherding young saints as only a tested mother can. The young man known for bombast and bravado grew into the meek author of some of Scripture's softest letters, urging us to "love one another" as "God so loves the world" for "God is love." No longer marked by "thunder," John had learned to "abide in the Vine" until his hard heart had been transformed by the tender, gentle hand of Heaven that makes weak and fallen men "great."

A rumor started in Galilee the week or so following Jesus' resurrection, that John the beloved would never die. ²⁴ In the playfulness of God, John was in fact the last of the twelve to cross the threshold of time and space to meet his Messiah in Paradise. But he spent his last years in exile on a small, rocky island in the Aegean Sea and was there—as an old man, alone without his friends, family, or faith community—entrusted with the Revelation of Jesus to prepare the Body of Jesus for the age-ending return of Jesus.

May we hold the Revelation with the kind of tempered, tender heart and sturdy hands that marked the aged John, the beloved disciple so confident in the Father's love that he was not threatened by the severity and pain of birth pangs. He simply longed for the new birth, the "renewal" and regeneration of what began in Eden, and he missed his Friend from Galilee. May we share the same commitment to the supreme exaltation of the only One we can trust; and may we, like John, feel the incredible relief when heaven reminds us we "need not weep." And may these songs help us see what this young man so transformed by the Vine's fruitful and better wine saw in his final days before joining the One we adore on the sea of glass.

COR behold, I create new heavens and a new earth; and the former shall not be remembered or come to mind. But be glad and rejoice forever in what I create; for behold, I create Jerusalem as a rejoicing, and her people a joy. I will rejoice in Jerusalem, and joy in My people; the voice of weeping shall no longer be heard in her, nor the voice of crying."

THE REVELATION

OF JESUS CHRIST

I

THE revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave him to show to his servants the things that must soon take place. He made it known by sending his angel to his servant John, ²who bore witness to the word of God and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, even to all that he saw. ³Blessed is the one who reads aloud the words of this prophecy, and blessed are those who hear, and who keep what is written in it, for the time is near.

⁴John to the seven churches that are in Asia:

Grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before his throne, 5 and from Jesus Christ the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth.

To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood ⁶ and made us a kingdom, priests to his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen. ⁷Behold, he is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see him, even those who pierced him, and all tribes of the earth will wail on account of him. Even so. Amen.

⁸ "I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, "who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty."

⁹I, John, your brother and partner in the tribulation and the kingdom and the patient endurance that are in Jesus, was on the island called Patmos on account of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. ¹⁰I

was in the Spirit on the Lord's day, and I heard behind me a loud voice like a trumpet "saying, "Write what you see in a book and send it to the seven churches, to Ephesus and to Smyrna and to Pergamum and to Thyatira and to Sardis and to Philadelphia and to Laodicea."

¹²Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me, and on turning I saw seven golden lampstands, ¹³ and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash around his chest. ¹⁴The hairs of his head were white, like white wool, like snow. His eyes were like a flame of fire, ¹⁵his feet were like burnished bronze, refined in a furnace, and his voice was like the roar of many waters. ¹⁶In his right hand he held seven stars, from his mouth came a sharp two-edged sword, and his face was like the sun shining in full strength.

¹⁷ When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. But he laid his right hand on me, saying, "Fear not, I am the first and the last, ¹⁸ and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades. ¹⁹ Write therefore the things that you have seen, those that are and those that are to take place after this. ²⁰ As for the mystery of the seven stars that you saw in my right hand, and the seven golden lampstands, the seven stars are the angels of the seven churches, and the seven lampstands are the seven churches.



THIS age began with Jesus' friendship with mankind in Paradise, and (as we'll see by the Revelation's end) the next age will as well—except the coming restoration and renewal has been bought with holy blood and cannot be lost to a snake's deceit. If we read The Revelation of Jesus with our hopes set on any lesser thing, we will miss the Man revealed in the mysteries. John the Beloved had the "eyes to see and ears to hear" so desperately needed simply because he missed his Friend, and wanted to be with Him again.



II & III

To the angel of the church in Ephesus write: 'The words of him who holds the seven stars in his right hand, who walks among the seven golden lampstands.

² "I know your works, your toil and your patient endurance, and how you cannot bear with those who are evil, but have tested those who call themselves apostles and are not, and found them to be false. ³I know you are enduring patiently and bearing up for my name's sake, and you have not grown weary. ⁴But I have this against you, that you have abandoned the love you had at first. ⁵Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first. If not, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place, unless you repent. ⁶Yet this you have: you hate the works of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate. ⁷He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who conquers I will grant to eat of the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God.'

⁸ "And to the angel of the church in Smyrna write: The words of the first and the last, who died and came to life.

⁹ "I know your tribulation and your poverty (but you are rich) and the slander of those who say that they are Jews and are not, but are a synagogue of Satan. ¹⁰Do not fear what you are about to suffer. Behold, the

devil is about to throw some of you into prison, that you may be tested, and for ten days you will have tribulation. Be faithful unto death, and I will give you the crown of life. "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. The one who conquers will not be hurt by the second death.'

¹² "And to the angel of the church in Pergamum write: 'The words of him who has the sharp two-edged sword.

13 "I know where you dwell, where Satan's throne is. Yet you hold fast my name, and you did not deny my faith even in the days of Antipas my faithful witness, who was killed among you, where Satan dwells. ¹⁴But I have a few things against you: you have some there who hold the teaching of Balaam, who taught Balak to put a stumbling block before the sons of Israel, so that they might eat food sacrificed to idols and practice sexual immorality. ¹⁵So also you have some who hold the teaching of the Nicolaitans. ¹⁶Therefore repent. If not, I will come to you soon and war against them with the sword of my mouth. ¹⁷He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who conquers I will give some of the hidden manna, and I will give him a white stone, with a new name written on the stone that no one knows except the one who receives it.'

19 "I know your works, your love and faith and service and patient endurance, and that your latter works exceed the first. 20 But I have this against you, that you tolerate that woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophetess and is teaching and seducing my servants to practice sexual immorality and to eat food sacrificed to idols. 21 gave her time to repent, but she refuses to repent of her sexual immorality. ²²Behold, I will throw her onto a sickbed, and those who commit adultery with her I will throw into great tribulation, unless they repent of her works, ²³ and I will strike her children dead. And all the churches will know that I am he who searches mind and heart, and I will give to each of you according to your works. ²⁴But to the rest of you in Thyatira, who do not hold this teaching, who have not learned what some call the deep things of Satan, to you I say, I do not lay on you any other burden. ²⁵Only hold fast what you have until I come. ²⁶The one who conquers and who keeps my works until the end, to him I will give authority over the nations, ²⁷ and he will rule them with a rod of iron, as when earthen pots are broken in pieces, even as I myself have received authority from my Father. ²⁸And I will give him the morning star. ²⁹He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.'

CHAPTER III.

ND to the angel of the church in Sardis write: 'The words of him who has the seven spirits of God and the seven stars.

"I know your works. You have the reputation of being alive, but you are dead. ²Wake up, and strengthen what remains and is about to die, for I have not found your works complete in the sight of my God. ³Remember, then, what you received and heard. Keep it, and repent. If you will not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what hour I will come against you. ⁴Yet you have still a few names in Sardis, people who have not soiled their garments, and they will walk with me in white, for they are worthy. ⁵The one who conquers will be clothed thus in white garments, and I will never blot his name out of the book


of life. I will confess his name before my Father and before his angels. ⁶He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.'

⁷ "And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write: The words of the holy one, the true one, who has the key of David, who opens and no one will shut, who shuts and no one opens.

8 "I know your works. Behold, I have set before you an open door, which no one is able to shut. I know that you have but little power, and yet you have kept my word and have not denied my name. 9Behold, I will make those of the synagogue of Satan who say that they are Jews and are not, but lie—behold, I will make them come and bow down before your feet, and they will learn that I have loved you. 10Because you have kept my word about patient endurance, I will keep you from the hour of trial that is coming on the whole world, to try those who dwell on the earth. 11I am coming soon. Hold fast what you have, so that no one may seize your crown. 12The one who conquers, I will make him a pillar in the temple of my God. Never shall he go out of it, and I will write on him the name of my God, and the name of the city of my God, the new Jerusalem, which comes down from my God out of heaven, and my own new name. 13He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.'

¹⁴ "And to the angel of the church in Laodicea write: 'The words of the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of God's creation.

were either cold or hot! ¹⁶So, because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth. ¹⁷For you say, I am rich, I have prospered, and I need nothing, not realizing that you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked. ¹⁸I counsel you to buy from me gold refined by fire, so that you may be rich, and white garments so that you may clothe yourself and the shame of your nakedness may not be seen, and salve to anoint your eyes, so that you may see. ¹⁹Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline, so be zealous and repent. ²⁰Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me. ²¹The one who conquers, I will grant him to sit with me on my throne, as I also conquered and sat down with my Father on his throne. ²²He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches."



THILE these seven letters were deliberately and strategically written for existing communities in John's day (like Ephesus, where he had served as a father, pastor, and apostle), they are included here for our benefit and edification. Invest seasons of your life into these letters, and sow their admonitions into your lives. When the LORD comes, He will test our lives by fire. All that will survive is the fruit borne from our obedience (love and allegiance) to Jesus. 10 These seven letters are meant to guide our decisions until that Day.

THEN I saw in the right hand of him who was seated on the throne a scroll written within and on the back, sealed with seven seals. ²And I saw a mighty angel proclaiming with a loud voice, "Who is worthy to open the scroll and break its seals?" ³And no one in heaven or on earth or under the earth was able to open the scroll or to look into it, ⁴and I began to weep loudly because no one was found worthy to open the scroll or to look into it. ⁵And one of the elders said to me, "Weep no more; behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has conquered, so that he can open the scroll and its seven seals."

'And between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders I saw a Lamb standing, as though it had been slain, with seven horns and with seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth. 'And he went and took the scroll from the right hand of him who was seated on the throne. 'And when he had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each holding a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. 'And they sang a new song, saying,

"Worthy are you to take the scroll

and to open its seals,

for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation,

 10 and you have made them a kingdom and priests to our God, and they shall reign on the earth."

¹¹Then I looked, and I heard around the throne and the living creatures and the elders the voice of many angels, numbering myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, ¹²saying with a loud voice,

"Worthy is the Lamb who was slain,

to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!"

¹³And I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, and all that is in them, saying,

"To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb

be blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever!"

¹⁴And the four living creatures said, "Amen!" and the elders fell down and worshiped.



WHEN John entered the throne room, he saw The Scroll, the title deed to created order—the blueprints on how to reverse the curse¹¹ and the power and permission to crush the head of the serpent.¹² But John knew no man or woman can be trusted with absolute power, and so he began to weep. But an elder assured him: One has overcome Adam's treason and temptations: Jesus, the Lion and the Lamb, could save us all. He is the only One worthy of our allegiance and adoration.

⁵And the beast was given a mouth uttering haughty and blasphemous words, and it was allowed to exercise authority for forty-two months. ⁶It opened its mouth to utter blasphemies against God, blaspheming his name and his dwelling, that is, those who dwell in heaven. ⁷Also it was allowed to make war on the saints and to conquer them. And authority was given it over every tribe and people and language and nation, ⁸and all who dwell on earth will worship it, everyone whose name has not been written before the foundation of the world in the book of life of the Lamb who was slain. ⁹If anyone has an ear, let him hear:

¹⁰If anyone is to be taken captive,

to captivity he goes; if anyone is to be slain with the sword, with the sword must he be slain.

Here is a call for the endurance and faith of the saints.

¹¹Then I saw another beast rising out of the earth. It had two horns like a lamb and it spoke like a dragon. 12 It exercises all the authority of the first beast in its presence, and makes the earth and its inhabitants worship the first beast, whose mortal wound was healed. 13It performs great signs, even making fire come down from heaven to earth in front of people, 14 and by the signs that it is allowed to work in the presence of the beast it deceives those who dwell on earth, telling them to make an image for the beast that was wounded by the sword and yet lived. 15And it was allowed to give breath to the image of the beast, so that the image of the beast might even speak and might cause those who would not worship the image of the beast to be slain. 16Also it causes all, both small and great, both rich and poor, both free and slave, to be marked on the right hand or the forehead, 17so that no one can buy or sell unless he has the mark, that is, the name of the beast or the number of its name. 18 This calls for wisdom: let the one who has understanding calculate the number of the beast, for it is the number of a man, and his number is 666.



THE enmity¹³ between the son of the Serpent and the Son of Eve will come to a head at the end of this age; the man we call the Antichrist will be fully given to and led by the Father of Lies.¹⁴ Yet he is not a myth of folklore, and we must "watch and pray"¹⁵ with sober minds,¹⁶ so we may provide clarity in a very confusing time.¹⁷ Daniel saw these days and fasted for understanding, and it was granted to him—may we do the same.¹⁸

⁹When He opened the fifth seal, I saw under the altar the souls of those who had been slain for the word of God and for the testimony which they held. ¹⁰And they cried with a loud voice, saying, "How long, O Lord, holy and true, until You judge and avenge our blood on those who dwell on the earth?" ¹¹Then a white robe was given to each of them; and it was said to them that they should rest a little while longer, until both the number of their fellow servants and their brethren, who would be killed as they were, was completed.

¹²I looked when He opened the sixth seal, and behold, there was a great earthquake; and the sun became black as sackcloth of hair, and the moon became like blood. ¹³And the stars of heaven fell to the earth, as a fig tree drops its late figs when it is shaken by a mighty wind. ¹⁴Then the sky receded as a scroll when it is rolled up, and every mountain and island was moved out of its place. ¹⁵And the kings of the earth, the great men, the rich men, the commanders, the mighty men, every slave and every free man, hid themselves in the caves and in the rocks of the mountains, ¹⁶and said to the mountains and rocks, "Fall on us and hide us from the face of Him who sits on the throne and from the wrath of the Lamb! ¹⁷For the great day of His wrath has come, and who is able to stand?"



A S Samuel Zwemer, the "Apostle to Islam," once said: "Our willingness to sacrifice for an enterprise is always in proportion to our faith in that enterprise." It is ours to bear witness of Him who is both Just and Justifier, and wait for His Day. ⁷When they finish their testimony, the beast that ascends out of the bottomless pit will make war against them, overcome them, and kill them. ⁸And their dead bodies will lie in the street of the great city which spiritually is called Sodom and Egypt, where also our Lord was crucified. ⁹Then those from the peoples, tribes, tongues, and nations will see their dead bodies three-and-a-half days, and not allow their dead bodies to be put into graves. ¹⁰And those who dwell on the earth will rejoice over them, make merry, and send gifts to one another, because these two prophets tormented those who dwell on the earth.

¹¹Now after the three-and-a-half days the breath of life from

God entered them, and they stood on their feet, and great fear fell on those who saw them. ¹²And they heard a loud voice from heaven saying to them, "Come up here." And they ascended to heaven in a cloud, and their enemies saw them. ¹³In the same hour there was a great earthquake, and a tenth of the city fell. It will seem, for a moment, as though the Beast prevails against them and cuts off the proclamation of the Word—but they'll be raised to stand and see the sky split when the Lord returns. In our relief, we'll worship Him for "taking His great power" and inaugurating His reign. 29

³So he carried me away in the Spirit into the wilderness. And I saw a woman sitting on a scarlet beast which was full of names of blasphemy, having seven heads and ten horns. ⁴The woman was arrayed in purple and scarlet, and adorned with gold and precious stones and pearls, having in her hand a golden cup full of abominations and the filthiness of her fornication. ⁵And on her forehead a name was written:

MYSTERY, BABYLON THE GREAT, THE MOTHER OF HARLOTS AND OF THE ABOMINATIONS OF THE EARTH.

⁶I saw the woman, drunk with the blood of the saints and with the blood of the martyrs of Jesus. And when I saw her, I marveled with great amazement.

⁷But the angel said to me, "Why did you marvel? I will tell you the mystery of the woman and of the beast that carries her, which has the seven heads and the ten horns. ⁸The beast that you saw was, and is not, and will ascend out of the bottomless pit and go to perdition. And those who

dwell on the earth will marvel, whose names are not written in the Book of Life from the foundation of the world, when they see the beast that was, and is not, and yet is.

9"Here is the mind which has wisdom: The seven heads are seven mountains on which the woman sits. ¹⁰There are also seven kings. Five have fallen, one is, and the other has not yet come. And when he comes, he must continue a short time. ¹¹The beast that was, and is not, is himself also the eighth, and is of the seven, and is going to perdition.

CHAPTER XVIII.

⁴And I heard another voice from heaven saying, "Come out of her, my people, lest you share in her sins, and lest you receive of her plagues. ⁵For her sins have reached to heaven, and God has remembered her iniquities. ⁶Render to her just as she rendered to you, and repay her double according to her works; in the cup which she has mixed, mix double for her. ⁷In the measure that she glorified herself and lived luxuriously, in the same measure give her torment and sorrow; for she says in her heart, 'I sit as queen, and am no widow, and will not see sorrow.' ⁸Therefore her plagues will come in one day—death and mourning and famine. And she will be utterly burned with fire, for strong is the Lord God who judges her.

⁹"The kings of the earth who committed fornication and lived luxuriously with her will weep and lament for her, when they see the smoke of her burning, ¹⁰standing at a distance for fear of her torment, saying, 'Alas, alas, that great city Babylon, that mighty city! For in one hour your judgment has come.'

¹¹"And the merchants of the earth will weep and mourn over her, for no one buys their merchandise anymore: ¹²merchandise of gold and silver, precious stones and pearls, fine linen and purple, silk and scarlet, every kind of citron wood, every kind of object of ivory, every kind of

object of most precious wood, bronze, iron, and marble; ¹³and cinnamon and incense, fragrant oil and frankincense, wine and oil, fine flour and wheat, cattle and sheep, horses and chariots, and bodies and souls of men. ¹⁴The fruit that your soul longed for has gone from you, and all the things which are rich and splendid have gone from you, and you shall find them no more at all. ¹⁵The merchants of these things, who became rich by her, will stand at a distance for fear of her torment, weeping and wailing, ¹⁶and saying, 'Alas, alas, that great city that was clothed in fine linen, purple, and scarlet, and adorned with gold and precious stones and pearls! ¹⁷For in one hour such great riches came to nothing.' Every shipmaster, all who travel by ship, sailors, and as many as trade on the sea, stood at a distance ¹⁸and cried out when they saw the smoke of her burning, saying, 'What is like this great city?'

¹⁹"They threw dust on their heads and cried out, weeping and wailing, and saying, 'Alas, alas, that great city, in which all who had ships on the sea became rich by her wealth! For in one hour she is made desolate.'

²⁰"Rejoice over her, O heaven, and you holy apostles and prophets, for God has avenged you on her!"

²¹Then a mighty angel took up a stone like a great millstone and threw it into the sea, saying, "Thus with violence the great city Babylon shall be thrown down, and shall not be found anymore. ²²The sound of harpists, musicians, flutists, and trumpeters shall not be heard in you anymore. No craftsman of any craft shall be found in you anymore, and the sound of a millstone shall not be heard in you anymore. ²³The light of a lamp shall not shine in you anymore, and the voice of bridegroom and bride shall not be heard in you anymore. For your merchants were the great men of the earth, for by your sorcery all the nations were deceived. ²⁴And in her was found the blood of prophets and saints, and of all who were slain on the earth."





S INCE Sinai, the people of God have been both charged and invited to love the LORD our God with all our hearts, minds, souls, and strength.³⁰ Fidelity to this holy privilege to love Him as He loves us³¹ prevents us from taking His name in vain.³² Our testimony at the end of this age will be that no matter the pressure, we'll despise every idol; we'll love Him more than we'll love our lives³³—and He will rescue us even from death, and we'll be with Him forever.³⁴

Her smoke rises up forever and ever!" ⁴And the twenty-four elders and the four living creatures fell down and worshiped God who sat on the throne, saying, "Amen! Alleluia!" ⁵Then a voice came from the throne, saying, "Praise our God, all you His servants and those who fear Him, both small and great!"

⁶And I heard, as it were, the voice of a great multitude, as the sound of many waters and as the sound of mighty thunderings, saying, "Alleluia! For the Lord God Omnipotent reigns! ⁷Let us be glad and rejoice and give Him glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and His wife has made herself ready." ⁸And to her it was granted to be arrayed in fine linen, clean and bright, for the fine linen is the righteous acts of the saints.

"Then he said to me, "Write: 'Blessed are those who are called to the marriage supper of the Lamb!' " And he said to me, "These are the true sayings of God." ¹⁰And I fell at his feet to worship him. But he said to me, "See that you do not do that! I am your fellow servant, and of your brethren who have the testimony of Jesus. Worship God! For the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy."

¹¹Now I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse. And He who

sat on him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness He judges and makes war. ¹²His eyes were like a flame of fire, and on His head were many crowns. He had a name written that no one knew except Himself. ¹³He was clothed with a robe dipped in blood, and His name is called The Word of God. ¹⁴And the armies in heaven, clothed in fine linen, white and clean, followed Him on white horses. ¹⁵Now out of His mouth goes a sharp sword, that with it He should strike the nations. And He Himself will rule them with a rod of iron. He Himself treads the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God. ¹⁶And He has on His robe and on His thigh a name written:

KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS.

¹⁷Then I saw an angel standing in the sun; and he cried with a loud voice, saying to all the birds that fly in the midst of heaven, "Come and gather together for the supper of the great God, ¹⁸that you may eat the flesh of kings, the flesh of captains, the flesh of mighty men, the flesh of horses and of those who sit on them, and the flesh of all people, free and slave, both small and great."

¹⁹And I saw the beast, the kings of the earth, and their armies, gathered together to make war against Him who sat on the horse and against His army. ²⁰Then the beast was captured, and with him the false prophet who worked signs in his presence, by which he deceived those who received the mark of the beast and those who worshiped his image. These two were cast alive into the lake of fire burning with brimstone. ²¹And the rest were killed with the sword which proceeded from the mouth of Him who sat on the horse. And all the birds were filled with their flesh.

CHAPTER XX.

THEN I saw an angel coming down from heaven, having the key to the bottomless pit and a great chain in his hand. ²He laid hold of the dragon, that serpent of old, who is the Devil and Satan, and bound him for a thousand years; ³and he cast him into the bottomless pit, and shut him up, and set a seal on him, so that he should deceive the nations no more till the thousand years were finished. But after these things he must be released for a little while.

⁴And I saw thrones, and they sat on them, and judgment was committed to them. Then I saw the souls of those who had been beheaded for their witness to Jesus and for the word of God, who had not worshiped the beast or his image, and had not received his mark on their foreheads or on their hands. And they lived and reigned with Christ for a thousand years. ⁵But the rest of the dead did not live again until the thousand years were finished. This is the first resurrection. ⁶Blessed and holy is he who has part in the first resurrection. Over such the second death has no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with Him a thousand years.

⁷Now when the thousand years have expired, Satan will be released from his prison ⁸and will go out to deceive the nations which are in the four corners of the earth, Gog and Magog, to gather them together to battle, whose number is as the sand of the sea. ⁹They went up on the breadth of the earth and surrounded the camp of the saints and the beloved city. And fire came down from God out of heaven and devoured them. ¹⁰The devil, who deceived them, was cast into the lake of fire and brimstone where the beast and the false prophet are. And they will be tormented day and night forever and ever.

¹¹Then I saw a great white throne and Him who sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away. And there was found no place for them. ¹²And I saw the dead, small and great, standing before God, and books were opened. And another book was opened, which is the Book of Life. And the dead were judged according to their works, by the things which were written in the books. ¹³The sea gave up the dead who were in it, and Death and Hades delivered up the dead who were in them. And they were judged, each one according to his works. ¹⁴Then Death and Hades were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. ¹⁵And anyone not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the lake of fire.





Doth "the wheat and the tares" will grow to full maturity³⁹ as "this present evil age"⁴⁰ ends when the One who dwells in unapproachable light⁴¹ appears in power and glory.⁴² When the Son of Man comes, He will find one global body committed to idolatrous lust, blasphemy, and wickedness (Babylon), and another committed to the purity of His life and covenant (Zion, the Bride of the Lamb).⁴³ His righteousness requires the total end of the harlot Babylon, while Jerusalem will be exalted forever by her enduring name and confession: THE LORD OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS.⁴⁴

There shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away."

⁵Then He who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new." And He said to me, "Write, for these words are true and faithful."

⁶And He said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. I will give of the fountain of the water of life freely to him who thirsts. ⁷He who overcomes shall

inherit all things, and I will be his God and he shall be My son. ⁸But the cowardly, unbelieving, abominable, murderers, sexually immoral, sorcerers, idolaters, and all liars shall have their part in the lake which burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second death."

Then one of the seven angels who had the seven bowls filled with the seven last plagues came to me and talked with me, saying, "Come, I will show you the bride, the Lamb's wife." ¹⁰And he carried me away in the Spirit to a great and high mountain, and showed me the great city, the holy Jerusalem, descending out of heaven from God, ¹¹having the glory of God. Her light was like a most precious stone, like a jasper stone, clear as crystal. ¹²Also she had a great and high wall with twelve gates, and twelve angels at the gates, and names written on them, which are the names of the twelve tribes of the children of Israel: ¹³three gates on the east, three gates on the north, three gates on the south, and three gates on the west.

¹⁴Now the wall of the city had twelve foundations, and on them were the names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb. 15 And he who talked with me had a gold reed to measure the city, its gates, and its wall. 16The city is laid out as a square; its length is as great as its breadth. And he measured the city with the reed: twelve thousand furlongs. Its length, breadth, and height are equal. 17Then he measured its wall: one hundred and forty-four cubits, according to the measure of a man, that is, of an angel. ¹⁸The construction of its wall was of jasper; and the city was pure gold, like clear glass. 19The foundations of the wall of the city were adorned with all kinds of precious stones: the first foundation was jasper, the second sapphire, the third chalcedony, the fourth emerald, 20the fifth sardonyx, the sixth sardius, the seventh chrysolite, the eighth beryl, the ninth topaz, the tenth chrysoprase, the eleventh jacinth, and the twelfth amethyst. ²¹The twelve gates were twelve pearls: each individual gate was of one pearl. And the street of the city was pure gold, like transparent glass.

²²But I saw no temple in it, for the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple. ²³The city had no need of the sun or of the moon to shine in it, for the glory of God illuminated it. The Lamb is its light. ²⁴And the nations of those who are saved shall walk in its light, and the kings of the earth bring their glory and honor into it. ²⁵Its gates shall not be shut at all by day (there shall be no night there). ²⁶And they shall bring the glory and the honor of the nations into it. ²⁷But there shall by no means enter it anything that defiles, or causes an abomination or a lie, but only those who are written in the Lamb's Book of Life.

CHAPTER XXII.

And he showed me a pure river of water of life, clear as crystal, proceeding from the throne of God and of the Lamb. ²In the middle of its street, and on either side of the river, was the tree of life, which bore twelve fruits, each tree yielding its fruit every month. The leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations. ³And there shall be no more curse, but the throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it, and His servants shall serve Him. ⁴They shall see His face, and His name shall be on

¹⁶"I, Jesus, have sent My angel to testify to you these things in the churches. I am the Root and the Offspring of David, the Bright and Morning Star."

¹⁷And the Spirit and the bride say, "Come!" And let him who hears say, "Come!" And let him who thirsts come. Whoever desires, let him take the water of life freely.

¹⁸For I testify to everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this book: If anyone adds to these things, God will add to him the plagues that are written in this book; ¹⁹ and if anyone takes away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part from the Book of Life, from the holy city, and from the things which are written in this book.

²⁰He who testifies to these things says, "Surely I am coming quickly." Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus!
